Advocacy/Public Policy NewsBev Fallik and Joan Clinch, Co-VPs

We welcome our new member, Barb Carter, and look forward to Barb's participation as we move forward. We've proceeded with our short term strategy; to discuss their perspectives of the committee's concerns about our bill (to extend child support to age 23 for post secondary education) and possible strategies for bill options for the coming year. We have already met with House Judiciary Committee members Pamela Queen and Vice Chair Kathleen Dumais and have learned a lot from these meetings. We have additional meetings scheduled in early September with Delegate Atterbeary and Chairman Valerio. We are especially delighted that Erin (see below) was able to arrange for Bev to join AAUW MD State Officers and Anna Palmisano (Kensington) to meet with Attorney General Brian Frosh and several of his staff. This was extremely productive and the AG agreed to update the AG opinion memo reiterating their support for the constitutionality of our bill (a major concern of the House committee). We now also have a contact at the AG office with the Chief Counsel for Legislative Affairs. We will be contacting our bill sponsor, Terri Hill, to update her on the outcomes of our meetings and discuss strategies for 2018.

Joan, Marcia and Beth represented us well at the July 29th Leadership conference and strategized our approach with Maryland's new Public Policy VP Erin Prangley. Erin is brimming with new ideas for improving networking and improving our bill's priority in the MD Assembly. This includes the use of several internet based tools for connecting across the state and automatically sending communications to our delegates.

Our next meeting will be August 28th at 1:30 PM at Wegmans. At that time, we discuss whether to continue meeting monthly at 1:30 PM at Wegmans on the 4th Monday of every month or if member schedules require us to change to another regularly scheduled monthly meeting. All are welcome!
