Please review the following budget. It will be voted on by the membership at the September Branch meeting.

Note: There are two \$2,000 scholarships to be given to HCC students; a new Generation Hope Scholarship of \$1,200 which goes to another HCC student through a special fund; increasing NCCWSL to cover three attendees; and increasing the President's fund to help cover State meeting fees. Based on recent fundraising efforts, and funds in reserve in our bank accounts, this should be a very workable budget.
