STATE CONVENTION REPORT Submitted by Diane Roca/Bea Dane

The AAUW Maryland Annual State Convention was held on April 8, hosted by the Easton Branch at the Eastern Shore Higher Education Center in Wye Mills. The theme was AAUW Maryland's Diamond Jubilee, marking 75 years since our state organization was founded in 1942. The celebration began on Friday evening, April 7 at dinner at the Miles River Yacht Club. Sixteen AAUW Maryland past presidents were honored. Each spoke briefly about the important events during her term in officer, painting a picture of the state organization's history.

Patricia Fae Ho, National AAUW Board Chair, came for the celebration as special guest and speaker. Opening events on Saturday morning, she brought 75th anniversary congratulations and news from the national organization. Reminding attendees that AAUW is a well-known and respected gender-equity organization, she said that AAUW's research reports are a major support of our work on STEM issues. The newest report, due out soon, is *Higher Ed, Higher Debt: Why Women Owe More,* about women and student loans. Next, Ms. Ho explained details of funding for AAUW's national programs. Dues contribute 15% of revenue, individual contributions provide 35% and the remaining 50% comes, in recent years, from the endowment. Costs have risen for nearly everything such as resources and programs, staff salaries and other items and a dues increase is required. After ten years of stable dues, if approved by the membership, national dues will increase by \$10.00 for the 2018-2019 year.

The keynote speaker was Linda Singh, Adjutant General of the Maryland National Guard. Her personal story was an inspiring testament to her determination, her development of leadership skills and mentorship of women in the National Guard. Major General Singh told the audience that the U.S. sets the precedent for what the world does, especially regarding women's rights. AAUW members contribute to our country's example for the world.

Cleopatra Campbell of the Frederick branch is the AAUW Maryland 2017 Woman of Distinction and will be honored at the National Convention of College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) in June. She spoke during lunch. Her message was "Invest in yourself" through education, and then give back as a volunteer in some way that inspires you.

In the afternoon, Anita Rosen, Public Policy Chair, gave a report on ways that AAUW Maryland members worked to pass legislation in Annapolis this year. She followed with a tutorial on how to support legislation by receiving *AAUW In Action* e-newsletters, contacting legislators by phone or email, or attending Lobby Day.

Advocacy/Public Policy News VP, Advocacy - Bev Fallik

After a month's "vacation", the committee is beginning to consider its advocacy for the upcoming year, focusing on the bill to provide support for post- secondary college/technical schools as well as other topics (StartSmart). We welcome our new members and were gratified to hear about the support voiced at the state conference and hope it continues. We also noted that NY State has passed a law for universal free tuition for college, that congress is considering "The Red Act" for free community college and that AAUW National is discussing the impact of student loans on women particularly. So, we seem to be heading in the same direction!

Meanwhile we discussed the obstacles encountered for our bill and also discussed perspectives and strategies for bill options for the coming year. We prioritized action steps and timelines for the next few months. Most immediately, we plan on meeting with our state policy representatives for any guidance and impressions they have. We will also be traveling to Annapolis to get copies of all support/opposition submitted and later schedule meetings with several of the Judiciary committee members to find out more about their deliberations. Other information gathering activities were also identified.

Until the Fall, the Advocacy Committee will meet monthly at Wegmans at 1:30pm on the 4th Monday of every month. Specific dates are: May 22, June 19, July 17 and August 21. Additional meetings will be convened as needed.
