The Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women (MLAW) is an organization whose membership includes some MD women's groups, including AAUW State level, and individuals. It was formed twenty years ago as a non-partisan group to lobby the Maryland General Assembly on issues selected by its membership relating to Maryland women and families.

This year, on Saturday, **Nov. 15**, the MLAW Fall Agenda Conference will be held in Howard County at the Miller Branch library. In the morning, groups present the legislative proposals that they support in the upcoming Maryland Assembly.
