Thanks to your responsiveness, we have enough volunteers for Girl Power at the Applied Physics Lab on March 11. I really appreciate your contributions with events like the practice SAT and Girl Power. Anne Trent is coordinating Discovery Fair, which will be held on April 14 at East Columbia Library, so if you want to volunteer to help with that, let her know.

We netted \$990 from the practice SAT, which goes to our scholarship funds. We send two female Howard Community College students a \$1500 scholarship to go on to a four- year college. We also send an HCC student to the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders in June. These are not our only philanthropies – remember the mug donation from November. We've also given contributions to Grass Roots and to Books for the Blind in Baltimore.

I'm telling you all this to prepare you to donate and/or purchase tickets to the Fashion Show on April 28 at 1:30 pm at Vantage House. We have plenty of models – members and their families. We need to sell tickets, so invite your friends and colleagues to the event. We made about \$2500 last year, and that is why we were able to increase the amount of the scholarships. Ms. Fairhurst taught theatre and directed numerous Broadway musicals as the drama teacher at Howard High School and at the Columbia School of Theatrical Arts. She directed a commedia dell arte production for the Renaissance Festival and wrote a musical for the bicentennial which was performed in the elementary schools in Howard County.

She co-founded with Toby Ornstein the first summer theatre camp for students and co-founded with Prudence Barry an acting workshop for adults as well.

Recently she has offered workshops on "Audition Preparation" and taught a workshop based on the book *The Artist's Way* by Julia Cameron. Sandy Fairhurst has a BA in theatre.
