Bev Fallik and Beth Hayden met with the Women's Commission in Frederick County which expressed support. There was a meeting with the MD AAUW liaison with colleges, Caitlin Brauer, and she will connect us with the branch at College Park.

The big event for November was the presentation of the bill for consideration at the MLAW (Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women) meeting. The bill was eloquently described by Bev Fallik and Del. Terri Hill and the vote for endorsement will take place in December. We are optimistic this go-around. The energy and counsel of Erin Prangley, AAUW State Public Policy VP, has been invaluable.

We received feedback that members in our own AAUW branch and other branches are requesting a message with clear steps to express support for the bill.


We are working on this to have it ready for the start of the 2018 session which begins in early January.
