

Advocacy/Public Policy News Bev Fallik and Joan Clinch, Co-VPs

The main focus of the committee continues to be active following and support of (2017#HB955) - Family Law – Age of Majority – Jurisdiction of the court – a bill which allows the court' to continue child support beyond the age of majority for higher education. We have significantly expanded the support for this bill including statewide AAUW, a number of AAUW branches (including at UMCP), and several Commissions on Women. We have received a very supportive and detailed opinion from the Attorney General and now have a powerful state Senator, Susan Lee, supporting the bill and ready to cross file in the Senate. The Diamondback (UMCP student newspaper) also included a supportive article about this bill.

In December, the committee met with Del. Ariana Kelly, chair of the Women's Caucus who expressed her support for the bill and gave the committee information on how to proceed to gain the support of he caucus. We have been awaiting the 2018 house and senate bill numbers to share with those who have indicated they would write letters of support. Unfortunately, two days after the 2018 Maryland Legislative session began, committee members met with Del Terri Hill who indicated that, after conferring with several family lawyers, she will be modifying some language. We are hoping the modifications remain allied with our goals. However, this delays the assignment of the new bill number and our ability to share the final bill with our supporters. Both delegate Hill and Senator Lee's Chief of Staff emphasized the importance of house and senate judiciary committee members hearing from their constituents across the state. We have been able to speak with branches in several counties but haven't located anyone in Chairman Vallario's district. If you know someone there, please ask them to help!
