There are some very important National by-law amendments that are currently being discussed and you will be given the opportunity to vote on them via on-line voting from April 25th through June 9th. These amendments are:

- 1) Having a staggered 3-year term for National Board members on a rotation basis, so that there is overlap in experience
- 2) Allowing non- AAUW members to be on the National Board of Directors
- 3) Eliminating the degree requirement for AAUW membership

These are some very controversial changes (at least 2 and 3), so I would highly recommend that you log into <u>AAUW.org</u> and read the comments – there are many both pro and con. And when the time comes, I hope EVERYONE will log in and VOTE on these amendments!!

Meanwhile, let's continue to be the great Branch that we are by our continued advocacy and support for women and girls in all aspects of their lives.

Advocacy/Public Policy News Bev Fallik and Joan Clinch, Co-VPs

On February 21 and 22, the Maryland House and Senate respectively held hearings on our bill to extend to age 23 the court's jurisdiction for child support for post-secondary education. As described in last month's newsletter, we were very disappointed that the bill had been changed at the last minute without our knowledge, although retaining some of what we had proposed. The comments at the hearings were not favorable, so it came as no surprise that we found that the House Judiciary unanimously voted unfavorably on March 8. Senator Lee's office notified us that on March 14, it was subsequently withdrawn in the Senate committee (which apparently automatically is an unfavorable vote). This is sad news but may also be an opportunity to redirect its focus correctly in the future. The other AAUW bill on the patient's bill of rights was also withdrawn.

Our Howard County Advocacy Committee will have its regular monthly meeting on March 27 at 10 a.m. to debrief. AAUW state policy officers also want to meet after the MD Assembly is over (after April 9th) to debrief and discuss future directions and strategies. We want to thank our fellow AAUW HoCo members for your support. It really helps. In fact, AAUW Maryland state officers reported that over 200 letters were sent in support of our bill from around the state.
