March is Women's History Month and our March guest speaker, Edith Mayer Cord, has quite a history to tell us. Born in Vienna in 1928, Edith moved to Italy with her family to escape the rise of Nazism in Austria. In 1938, Italy passed the same anti-Jewish laws, and the entire family was asked to leave. Unable to receive a visa for any country, Edith and her family entered France illegally in April 1939 where they received political asylum. In July 1943, Edith went into hiding with false papers with the help of the Jewish scouts of France and their clandestine arm, the Sixième. She spent a year on the run, hiding in different schools, until she was smuggled into Switzerland in May 1944 with a group of thirty Jewish children. Eventually, she made it to the US in the early 1950's. Edith has written a book (available in our library) <u>Becoming Edith: The Education of a Hidden Child.</u> She will share her experiences and the lessons learned the hard way: how to rise above difficult circumstances, transcend hatred, find meaning and protect our freedom.


Thanks to all of you who have agreed to take on leadership positions! Our branch elects half the Board each year, so there is an overlap of experience.

MARCH PROGRAM WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH

On March 13th, we return to evening Branch meetings at 1st Evangelical Lutheran Church located at 3604 Chatham Road in Ellicott City (the corner of Chatham Road and Frederick Road-Rte. 144).

We are very fortunate to have Edith M. Cord as our speaker. Ms. Cord was born in Vienna, Austria, in 1928. As a young Jewish girl, she experienced first-hand the horrific rise of Nazism driving her family to seek asylum elsewhere Unable to secure visas, the family illegally in Europe. entered France. They were eventually granted political asylum. This proved short lived. At the outbreak of World War II, her father and later her brother were arrested and ultimately taken to Auschwitz. She never saw either again. At fourteen she went into hiding with false papers until she could be smuggled into Switzerland. Although safe from Nazi persecution, she was deprived of an education and found work as a Nanny. After the war she was reunited with her mother who was still in France. She struggled through the next seven years while simultaneously attempting to earn a living, come to terms with man's inhumanity toward



his fellow man, and pursue an education. Her powerful and poignant story is a true testament to her strength and courage.

Salary Negotiation Seminar

Howard Community College holds a 3-year license to conduct the AAUW program of Start Smart. On Wednesday, March 21, Debbie Munley and Suzanne Soules will facilitate this seminar to help soon-to graduate women negotiate the best salary and benefits as they interview for their new jobs.

The goal of this program is to decrease the gender wage gap that is still prevalent in the US today. We have often heard that women earn approximately 80 percent of what a man does for the same work. This holds true, even now in the 21st century. The long-term consequences of the salary gap means over \$418,800 less money for women to spend while they are working and significantly less to live on when they retire. The numbers for women of color are even more dire. Knowing what the job is worth to a company, and being able to articulate her own worth will go a long way to getting a fair starting salary.

Advocacy/Public Policy News Bev Fallik and Joan Clinch, Co-VPs

The Committee has continued its focus on SB965 and HB1152, which extends the court's authority until age 23 for post-secondary education support. As mentioned in the last newsletter, some of the bill's language had been changed at the last minute without our knowledge which was unfortunate. Nevertheless, it still included the post-secondary support extension, so we continued our support, along with AAUWMaryland and NOW. The hearings were February 21 (Senate) and February 22 (House). We are very appreciative of the written support the bill received, calls that were made, and the several brave AAUW members who traveled to the hearing to show their support. We were delighted to see Suzanne Soules and Barbara Carter as well as several representatives from Baltimore and Ann Arundel Counties. Both days, Caitlin Brauer (AAUW MD College Liaison/Baltimore County) joined Marcia Posner and Bev Fallik to provide oral testimony before both committees. Anita Rosen (AAUW MD/Montgomery County) and Linda Mahoney (NOW) joined us to provide Senate testimony on Wednesday.

We are extremely grateful to Senator Susan Lee (Montgomery County) and her chief of staff Michael Lore for the help and support they've provided this year. We also thank Howard County Delegate Terri Hill for her continued support. Unfortunately, neither committee was very receptive and there is little likelihood of the bill passing this year. The committees mostly continued their focus on the constitutionality regarding children of married vs. divorced parents -- despite the MD Attorney General's clear-cut 14 page formal opinion in support of our position, despite similar states successfully countering such challenges, and despite the fact that 16 states already have such a law. After the hearing, Terri did note a few areas where we had previously pointed out problems and agreed that they should be rectified. We are taking a well -earned break and will be revisiting our strategy soon.


