The past month has been focused on planning. We've had several fruitful conversations with Delegate Terri Hill's legislative director and Senator Susan Lee's chief of staff. A meeting has been scheduled with Delegate Hill and Senator Lee on Nov. 8th after the election. We are hoping to attend as well. Discussion will center on recommended changes to the bill to extend child support for post-secondary education and related topics, such as working with members of the Assembly's education committees. Our committee has a formidable agenda for the upcoming months. We are updating the bill to submit a proposal for presentation at the Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women Conference (MLAW) scheduled for Nov. 17th. We need to contact and expand our supportive network especially AAUW and NOW branches, University and Community College Administrators, student organizations and other potential allies. We also need to dialogue with groups that opposed the bill to see if their issues can be addressed. We are hoping that more members of our branch will join us. For example, we are hoping that someone will want to cover the county council and BoEd meetings to assure women's rights (e.g. title IX) are strong.

Members of AAUW Maryland met in Bethesda for the Fall Conference on October 20. Kensington-Rockville, the host branch, arranged an interesting day about topics of current interest to AAUW – Getting Out the Vote, encouraging activities at colleges and universities, and building connections within AAUW MD.

Ralph Watkins, a member of the League of Women Voters, discussed ways to encourage people to vote. In conversations, people mention two problems that are the two main barriers to voting: 1) People don't know who is running or what their positions are on the issues and 2) People forget to update their voter registration, especially to enter a new address when they move. He introduced us to websites that solve these problems – the League's **VOTE411.org** for candidate information and **Elections.maryland.gov** to verify registration and update an address.

Students from Frostburg State talked about their brand-new chapter of AAUW. They are putting their energy into useful efforts on campus, particularly addressing sexism and sexual assault issues. Then Kaitlin Riszk, NCCWSL attendee, introduced us to her new company *Stempower* that mentors young girls in self-confidence and STEM projects.
