### Women's Suffrage in Maryland - a story map presentation

On March 12 we will have two of our members, Diana Bailey and Bea Dane, presenting "The History of Women's Suffrage in Maryland" using an intriguing "story map" that was researched through support by a grant from the Maryland Historical Trust. This grant funded the documentation of 50 previously unrecognized sites in Maryland where women demonstrated, lobbied and were jailed in support of women's right to vote. This interactive tour provides names we haven't heard, as well as forgotten and familiar places that played important roles in the 70-year struggle for women's suffrage in Maryland. We'll also get a preview of plans to commemorate our suffrage, planned for 2020.

Diana Bailey is the Executive Director of the Maryland Women's Heritage Center and Bea Dane serves on the Center's Executive Board.

## Public Policy Joan Clinch and Bev Fallik, Co-VPs

The Maryland Assembly is now in high gear. We now have two somewhat different versions of the bill. The Senate version (SB 264) is simpler and the Hearing Date was February 13. We do not yet know the outcome of their vote. The House version (HB 937) adds factors for courts to consider. The House hearing is March 7th at 1:00 PM. Marcia Posner and I testified at the Senate hearing along with Kate Stevenson, AAUW Maryland State Co-President, and Linda Mahoney, ex-President of Maryland NOW.

## **Status of the Equal Rights Amendment**

The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) to the U.S. Constitution would guarantee constitutional equality between men and women — a concept a majority of Americans agree is necessary. First proposed in 1923, the ERA was ratified by 35 of the necessary 38 states by 1977. However, Congress imposed a deadline to complete ratification by 1982. In 2017 and 2018, Nevada and Illinois became the 36th and 37th states, respectively, to ratify the ERA. Now several states are striving to be the 38th. A particularly robust campaign is underway in Virginia where AAUW of Virginia advocates are leading the charge. If Virginia, or another state, ratifies the amendment further action from Congress would be necessary to complete the process. [Editor's Note: After this article was written, Virginia delegates voted against ratification. You may be interested to know that Maryland ratified the ERA on May 26, 1972.]

Meanwhile, other states are working to add similar protections to their state constitutions. In January, with the support of AAUW of Delaware members, Delaware lawmakers amended their state constitution to include: "Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged on account of sex." A similar measure is moving forward in the Minnesota legislature.
