Opioids –What You Should Know and Why

On September 10th our speaker will be Liesele Wood who is Howard County Health Department's Prevention Administrator. She'll be talking with us about the opioid crisis and its impact on Howard County - especially on folks in our age cohort. I was surprised to learn how many opioid overdoses and dependence issues stem from legitimate prescriptions. As we get older, and our experiences of pain become more frequent, the chance that we will be prescribed an opioid also increases. Many folks have become dependent or overdosed because they trusted that if it was prescribed and they followed instructions these drugs must be safe. She will be talking about Howard County's response to the opioid crisis (there are many resources available) and questions we might ask our doctors to avoid problems. She will also offer information and instruction on naloxone which can prevent death in case of an accidental overdose. Naloxone will be available to take home for any attendees who want it. Feel free to bring friends or family members to this presentation. It's an important issue!

If you are interested in a wider view of this topic, I am currently reading a new book called "In Pain: A Bioethicist's Personal Struggles with Opioids" written by Travis Rieder, who actually works at Johns Hopkins University. He raises a lot of troubling issues based on his own experiences after a serious motorcycle accident that crushed his foot. He was prescribed heavy doses of opioids by doctors who had no real knowledge of how addicting they were or how to wean him off them. Did you know that most doctors take no courses on pain management? Food for thought! I spoke to Ms. Wood about this book and she had several comments about recent actions Center for Disease Control has taken related to these issues. This should be a very interesting conversation. Hope to see you there!





Report from the Board

The board has taken actions recently that will come up for a vote at the business meeting at the September Potluck.

- 1. Approved the budget for 2019-2020. See page 6.
- Approved creation of a combined Membership and Diversity Vice President position. This VP will form a committee to increase both membership and diversity within our branch. As a new board position, it requires a change in our bylaws and must be approved by the membership. The revised bylaw is below on page 7.

Deb Wade has agreed to be the Membership and Diversity VP.

3. Approved plans for a fundraising tea, now being planned by the Philanthropy Committee, that will honor women who have achieved significant positions in Howard County.

We raised \$7,100 for eight scholarship recipients in 2019.

- **Two scholarships** (one \$2,000 and one \$1,000) for women transferring from Howard Community College (HCC) to a four-year institution to earn a bachelor's degree
- Four scholarships (\$750 each) for women continuing their classes at HCC
- **Two scholarships** (\$550 each) for young women to attend AAUW's National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL.) This three-day conference is held annually at the University of Maryland College Park in late Spring where women from all over the United States attend skill-building workshops, hear motivational speakers and network with other student leaders.

Proposed Bylaw Amendment

Proposed Bylaw Amendment

At the September potluck, the following amendment to the branch bylaws will be presented for approval by the members in attendance.

ARTICLE IX. OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers

- a. The eleven elected officers for the Affiliate shall be President, First Vice President, Advocacy Public Policy Vice President, Communications Vice President, Education Vice President, Finance Officer, Membership and Diversity Vice President, Philanthropy Vice President, Program Vice President, Social Vice President and Secretary.
- b. Officers shall serve for a term of two years. Term of office shall begin on July 1.
- c. No elected officer shall hold more than one office at a time. Elected officers shall be eligible to serve two consecutive terms in the same office. They may serve additional terms if a successor cannot be found in a reasonable amount of time.
- d. All vacancies in office shall be filled by appointment for the expired term by the Board.
- e. Each office may be filled by an officer or co-officers.
- f. The following officers shall be elected in even years: President, First Vice President, Education Vice President, Membership and Diversity Vice President, and Program Vice President. The following officers shall be elected in odd years: Advocacy Public Policy Vice President, Communications Vice President, Finance Officer, Philanthropy Vice President, Social Vice President and Secretary.
