

Education and Scholarships Suzanne Soules, VP

Thank you all for the great success of the Tea in October. As you know, the one concrete way we are supporting women in Howard County is through the scholarships at Howard Community College. Last year we awarded 6 plus 2 to the leadership conference. With our current fundraising, we may be able to increase the amount or add some awards. We are working on a better way to process the monies. It will help Maureen Marshall at Career Links do less work and our treasurers do less check writing. It may also be a way to get our AAUW – Howard County name more credit for all our funding. The school has naming opportunities for spaces at the school with plaques posted in study areas, classrooms, assembly halls or labs. If we make a commitment for a certain time period, they will put our name up on a plaque in an area of the school. We are gathering information before a final decision is made. <u>The education committee</u> will meet on Wednesday. January 8. 2020 at 7 pm in Wegmans' upper lounge.

If you would like to be on the committee, we welcome you. Please let Suzanne know (suzanne.soules@gmail.com) We will make plans for **Girl Power**, the STEM fair held at Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Lab in March. We can discuss other ways we may want to support women and girls locally.

Public Policy Lucie Geinzer and Bev Fallik, Co-VPs

The Public Policy Committee has been very active collecting information regarding the priority issues we've identified.

- (1) <u>Title IX</u>- We are interested in what data are required in reports, what data HoCo have and what activities/efforts are made to ensure gender equality in our schools. Penny is following up w/ national AAUW and Joan is following up locally with the HoCo Board of Ed and/or the County Council.
- (2) <u>Human Trafficking</u>- Marcia and Bev attended the HoCo Conference on Human Trafficking which was very informative. While there appear many organizations working to prevent and deter trafficking, there appear two organizations that provide the main support for victims. These are Grassroots and HopeWorks. MLAW historically also prioritizes legislation to combat trafficking and de-criminalizing victims. Our branch will provide support to those organizations and related legislation. Penny will look into what specific types of support we might provide.
- (3) <u>Higher Education</u>- Bev met w/ the Education Committee of Indivisible which is also interested in addressing the high cost of education and suggested perhaps coordinating a two-pronged approach. We would support each other's efforts. We agreed that the 2021 Assembly would be the goal. Marcia will investigate which states already provide free tuition (2 year and 4 year institutions).

(4) We discussed the upcoming Dec. 6th meeting w/ Dels. Hill and Atterbeary. Our issues cluster around two topics: opposition (e.g. family bar, behind the scenes committee members, other) and timing of bill finalization in terms of networking.

We also thought it important to let the branch know about the <u>MD Legislative Summit</u>--another conference of statewide coalitions that is occurring on December 15th at UMBC and is attended by organizations familiar to us. Report from the MLAW Conference Nov. 23, 2019

MLAW is celebrating its 25th anniversary in 2019. This strong collaboration of the collective power of women's groups and individuals has resulted in the passage of 90 pieces of legislation over the past 25 years. AAUW was well represented at the conference. Beth Hayden, Barbara Carter and Bev Fallik represented HoCo AAUW. The meeting is a wonderful opportunity for networking with other likeminded women's groups across the state. The new House Speaker, Adrienne Jones, provided informative and inspiring remarks to attendees and answered questions from the audience. She emphasized the importance of bills generated from grassroots constituents. Nineteen legislative proposals for the upcoming 2020 session of the Maryland General Assembly were presented. Of these bills, 6-8 will make up MLAW's 2020 Agenda. MLAW has sent ballots to all MLAW members in good standing.
