As many of you know, MWHC is a nonprofit, statewide organization that works to ensure that the stories and accomplishments of Maryland's women, past and present, are celebrated and included in history.

Their programs celebrate all women and their sometimes overlooked accomplishments. They honor diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility. Their tagline is "We add HERstory to history to tell Our story".

In addition to introducing us to some of Maryland's most fascinating, yet (sometimes) unknown women, Ms. Santora will also give a us preview of 2023's programs and events, including:

Memories of the Woman's Industrial Exchange - a look at the women who made this consignment shop and restaurant an enduring Baltimore landmark and memory for many who grew up in Baltimore.



The Education Committee met January 5, 2023, and launched a number of activities for the spring. Girl Power will take place at Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Lab, Fulton, on Sunday March 12. It will be in the new STEM building on the South Campus, from 2 – 5 pm. The target audience is elementary and middle schoolgirls. Our booth will be "Reach for the Stars" with member Sethanne Howard serving as our resident astrophysicist. She will project images from the new James Webb Telescope and answer any questions the girls have about being an astronomer. We will hand out self-inflating balloons; crossword and word search puzzles along with Starburst candy.

The National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) will be held in person at the University of Maryland, College Park May 31 – June 2, 2023. Women from all over the country come together to attend workshops, hear motivational speakers and network with other students. Many of you may not be aware that in addition to being your branch treasurer, I am also on the Board of AAUW Maryland as the Vice President for Funds. One of my major duties has been to coordinate the selection of our 2023 Woman of Distinction. AAUW Maryland has sponsored a Woman of Distinction at the National Conference of College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) for many years. Our selection for this year is Maryland Secretary of State Susan Clair Lee. Below is information on this very talented woman who is now in a very prominent position in Maryland. I have also included information on how to donate to our Woman of Distinction fund. Donations to this fund are tax deductible. Support our 2023 Maryland Women of Distinction! Maryland Secretary of State Susan Clair Lee

Last fall, AAUW Maryland chose then State Senator Susan C. Lee as our 2023 Woman of Distinction. Susan now is the Maryland Secretary of State, having been appointed on January 18, 2023, by Governor Wes Moore. She will be honored at 2023 NCCWSL (National Conference of College Women Student Leaders) on June 2nd at the University of Maryland, College Park.

Susan was a member of the Maryland State Senate from January 2015 through January 2023 and served as the Majority Whip from 2019-2022. She previously served in the Maryland House of Delegates from 2022-2015. She is the first Asian American elected to the Maryland State Senate and was the first Asian American Woman and first Chinese American to be elected to the Maryland legislature.

Throughout her long legislative career, Susan Lee has been a champion for women and youth rights. She was elected to serve two terms as president of the Women Legislators of Maryland (Women's Legislative Caucus.)

She has a BA in Political Science from the University of Maryland, College Park, and a J.D. from the University of San Francisco School of Law. She is a member of two Maryland AAUW branches – Bethesda-Chevy Chase and Kensington-Rockville.

A Few ERA Notes

It's been 98 years since the Equal Rights Amendment was first introduced in Congress. It's been 49 years since the ERA was passed by Congress. In order to become a part of the Constitution, the amendment must be approved by three-fourths (38) of the states.

- 97% of Americans say it is somewhat or very important for women to have equal rights with men in this country. (source, Pew Research Center)
- 80% of Americans mistakenly believe the U.S. Constitution already guarantees gender equality. (source, ERA Coalition)
- 78% of Americans specifically favor adding the 28th Amendment (Equal Rights) to the Constitution. Among Republicans and Republican leaners 66% agree with the addition and among Democrats and Democratic leaners there is 88% agreement. (source, Pew Research Center)
