Cost: \$42 per guest (20% will be donated to us if we have at least 20 people).


There will be a bar available (cash or credit) and 10% of all bar sales will be donated to us. Non-alcoholic drinks and snacks will be available for free.


# "Nothing But the Truth"

# **AAUW Dues Information**

The AAUW National office has sent the following information about members' dues.

Individual members and students will not see a change in national dues for FY 2025. The proposed change to the Action Fund dues will simply reallocate those dues to AAUW, Inc. As a result, individual member dues will now be fully tax deductible, whereas previously only a portion of the dues were tax deductible.

The reallocation of the \$3 from the AAUW Action Fund to AAUW Inc. is both a procedural change to streamline AAUW's operations, a key goal for the Board and an added benefit in that it makes the annual dues of \$72, fully tax deductible [beginning in Spring 2024]. Again, there will be no change to national individual member dues for FY 2025.



# March for the ERA

AAUW and several other organizations - including GenerationRatify, the League of Women Voters, and NOW - met at Lafayette Square in Washington DC on December 13 to march in support of certification of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) to the US Constitution.

AAUW Maryland was represented by several participants from various branches. Representing our Howard County branch were Barb Carter and Diane Roca who braved a chilly day to march 1 ½ miles from the White House to the US Capitol where Representative Ayanna Pressley (D; MA) held a news conference. AAUW CEO Gloria Blackwell was one of the speakers.

The ERA was first proposed 100 years ago, and the marchers carried the message that it must be certified now. "Not One Year More!" read some of the posters.
